[NURS FPX 4015 Assessment 1](#) shifts the focus toward patient-centered care and individualized health promotion strategies. In this assessment, students create care plans tailored to patients from diverse backgrounds and with unique cultural, social, or health needs. Emphasis is placed on holistic nursing practices, clinical reasoning, and ethical decision-making. By the end, students demonstrate how to integrate patient values, health literacy, and professional standards into a cohesive plan of care.

Building on the skills from the first part, [NURS FPX 4015 Assessment 2](#) explores the dynamics of team-based healthcare delivery. This assignment involves developing a collaborative care plan that incorporates contributions from various healthcare professionals. Students are expected to apply communication frameworks, such as SBAR or the TeamSTEPPS model, to ensure effective teamwork and coordination. The assessment reinforces how interprofessional collaboration leads to better patient outcomes and system-level efficiency.
